VIDEO CAMERAS

Video cameras may only be used within the Show premises with the prior permission of the Committee when a pass to do so will be issued. Even with that permission, filming may not take place of any particular exhibit without the express permission of the owner of that exhibit, and in any case must under no circumstances disrupt judging.

IMPORTANT NOTICE EXERCISE AREA

An Exercise Area will be provided. Exhibitors/Handlers are required to clear up any fouling by the dogs in their charge.

IF YOUR DOG HAS AN ACCIDENT ANYWHERE CLEAN IT UP

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 9.30am approx
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00am prompt.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The show will close 30 minutes after all judging has been completed, by which time all dogs must be removed.
5. **ENTRY FEES:** First Entry £22.00; Members £27.00 Non members; all subsequent entries with same dog £3.00; Non-CC classes £12.00 Members, £15.00 Non-members, Bay Puppy classes £5.00. Not for Competition £3.00; Catalogue £3.00 each ordered with entry. Further entry forms from <http://www.bsdaofgb.co.uk>.
6. There will be no Prize Money paid at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under 4 calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

10. BEST PUPPY IN SHOW

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed or Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. The selection of Best in Show may follow the selection of Best Puppy in Show and Best Veteran in Show (if scheduled) respectively. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively.

A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Baby Puppy classes are scheduled. Best Baby Puppy in Show will be declared from the dogs entered in the Baby Puppy breed classes. There will be no progression to further competition

11. BEST IN SHOW

The dog declared Best in Show must be selected from Best in Breed, Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the breed judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best in Show.

12. Exhibits will not be admitted to the Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the Special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete Number before the entry can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete Number will be returned to the exhibitor.
16. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form.
17. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
18. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.
19. Entries will not be accepted without the correct fees and all monies due to the Association, which remain unpaid, either unpaid fees or bank charges accrued through dishonoured cheques, will be reported to the Kennel Club.

20. Change of Judge: should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their appointment the Committee reserve to themselves the right to appoint another to fulfil the duty. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fee will be returned.
21. Every possible care will be exercised by the committee to ensure the safety of dogs at the Show but it must be strictly understood by exhibitors and persons concerned that the Committee accept no responsibility for any loss or damage to dogs or their property.
22. Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
23. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
24. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration or addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Rules shall be sufficient notice thereof.
25. All children must be kept under control and parents will be held responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
26. Please do not obstruct gangways with cages, pens, grooming tables, trolleys and dogs. Storage space will be made available for trolleys/ cages.
27. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances.
28. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
29. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)
30. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of the appropriate entry fees.
31. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(the word "dog" includes both sexes)

In the following Definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Member's classes or competing for Member's Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. **Tuesday July .1st 2025** Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) WITHDRAWAL The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 20.
- (2) TRANSFER
 - a) If the dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy

class or the Junior class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class or Junior class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibitor arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

With these provisos the following are The Definitions of certain classes:-

Baby Puppy	For dogs of four & not exceeding six months of age on the day of the Show
Puppy:	For dogs of six & not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show
Junior:	For dogs of six & not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show
Yearling	For dogs of twelve & not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the day of the Show
Postgraduate:	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed..
Limit:	For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
Open:	All dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show
Veteran:	Dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show
Not For Competition:	Including from breeds of dog over 4 months of age, including or not included within the title of the Society. Full details must be recorded on the entry form.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (ANNEX B)

- 1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition at a Show. When a dog is found to have been prepared for exhibition at a show in contravention of these Regulations the exhibitor will be dealt with as if a complaint under Kennel Club Rule A.42 had been lodged against them and proved to the satisfaction of the General Committee without prejudice to the right of the exhibitor to make representations to the General Committee in mitigation of the penalty to be imposed at the discretion of the General Committee under Rule 42. The dog will be automatically disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat .
- 2 No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition either before or at the Show. Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat of a dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed and nothing may be done, calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive except:
 - Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
 - The removal of dewclaws of any breed
 - The shortening of tails of customarily docked breeds
 - Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Use of Electrical Equipment at Shows

The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at

shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices.

Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used.

The Kennel Club has also been informed of recent instances of exhibitors commandeering certain areas of a venue in order to have access to power points so as to use electrical grooming equipment. This is totally unacceptable and particularly unfair on the breeds whose allocated areas have been cramped because of this selfish behaviour.

Security at shows

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all Societies of the importance of security at dog shows. The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows. The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert.

TRADE STANDS

The committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the show and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

Meet the Judges

Sonny Ström has been a breeder of Belgian Shepherd/Malinois/Groenendael/Tervueren from 1985 and has also Imported and exported several quality Belgian Shepherd dogs from Belgium, France, Finland, Czech Republic,



Netherland, France, Denmark, Finland, Norway and Lithuania. His judging career started early 1997, together with 15 other selected to undergo the Swedish Kennel Club's judge training program, in August 1997 he was authorized on his first breeds. Since 2018 he is considered to be a group all-rounder for FCI group 1 and 4, since 2025 also group all-rounder for FCI group 2, also in the program for group 5 and group 6, and authorized for many breeds within both FCI groups 3 and 9. He has judged specialties, national and international dog shows in the Nordic countries and most of the countries around Europe, twice in Australia, several winner shows in Amsterdam, Helsinki, Stockholm, Oslo, Herning, Birmingham, Opole and Nitra. He is also very honored to have been invited to judge European Winner 2026. He is also authorized as a behaviour judge, 2001 judge mental description (MH), 2006 judge Mental test (MT), 2023 judge Behavior and Personality Assessment Dogs test (BPH). He has also competed

with several dogs in elite class tracking, higher class search, higher class messenger and obedience class 3, and between 2002-2006 trained and educated his own dogs for military service (TJH HV). He is looking forward to meeting all of you for a lovely show and stay!

Glenn Moore writes 'Firstly I would like to thank the Belgian Shepherd Dog Association of Great Britain for my



second invitation to judge at your Championship show and Norbel for your first invitation to judge at this year's Championship shows. My story starts at the age of 3 when my parents purchased their first Collie Rough. Breeding, showing and obedience. While doing obedience we met a fellow Collie enthusiast Jan Carroll. Jan later went into a new breed to the country, the Belgian Shepherd (Groenendael). Keeping in touch with Jan at shows and showing her Groenendael bitch in child handlers I was given a Groenendael bitch from Jan's first litter. 45 years later my involvement in the Belgian Shepherd continues. At the age of 15 I bred my first litter. I hated the feeling when each of the 10 puppies left home, I kept one myself. I decided breeding is not for me. To this day this is my only litter. This is why I don't call myself a breeder but a Belgian Shepherd enthusiast. Over the years I have owned and shown many Belgians for others including the stunning Aust Ch Grimmendans Yucan (Imp Blg) to a record of 9 Best in Specialty shows and 4 Runner up Best in shows in Australia. In 1994 I imported the Tervueren Aust Ch Belamba Par Avion (Imp UK) out of Bergerac Love Kills x France de la Douce Plaine. "Zorro" was a big winner in the All breeds ring with numerous Best exhibit in

group awards at Champ show level and was the first Tervueren to win a BIS at an All Breeds show in the state of Victoria. In 2014 I imported Aust Supreme Ch sr Corsini Galiano (Imp UK) "Basil" 3 x Best in Specialty shows, 1 x Runner Up BISS, Res CAC French National 2019, Res CAC Belgium National 2019. Plus countless in group and in show awards. Basil is the first Belgian Shepherd of any variety to obtain the title of Supreme Champion in the state of Victoria. For the last 14 years I have been President of The Belgian Shepherd Dog Club of Victoria. In 1993 I achieved my championship show license for our Working dog group, UK Herding group, FCI group 1. Since then I have judged in majority of states in Australia and New Zealand. Including being the only Australian breed specialist to have judged a specialty show in Australia. Having this honour twice. I am also the only Australian breed specialist to have judged the breed in the country of origin (Belgium twice). I also judged Tervueren bitch at the BSDA championship show 2006 where my CC winner went on to BOB and eventually BIS. Over the years I have had the opportunity to travel to Europe many times to visit kennels and shows and last year to the USA. Always trying to improve my knowledge of the Belgian Shepherd. Once again I'd like to thank the BSDA and Norbel for the honour of judging your 2025 back to back Championship shows.'
